GCSE Drama: from Creation Myths to 'Blood Brothers'


On Monday 16 January, GCSE Drama students were treated to an all-day 'Blood Brothers' workshop by Stage-Ed, led by former performers from the musical. The day's workshop gave students the chance to explore the characters, key scenes, scouse accent and helped to prepare them for Section B of the written exam. This is an invaluable revision tool for the students and lays the foundations to answering four questions from the paper, which looks at design features as well as performer demands.




Just over a week later on Wednesday 25 January, Year 11 Drama students had a day off timetable to rehearse and perform their Component 2, Devised examination piece. The stimulus was Ancient Creation Myths, and the students had the opportunity to either perform or be designers. These pieces are assessed by Mr Morgan and Mr Meadows, and then will be externally moderated by AQA. A huge thank you goes to Mr Meadows for his invaluable tech support, and to all students involved for their hard work. Students now need to complete the remainder of the NEA for this Component before welcoming in an AQA examiner for their scripted pieces on Wednesday 29th March.

Alongside this, Drama in Key Stage 3 has seen students working on their second Drama assessment of the year, with Year 7 working on Ghost Stories, Year 8 with Mask & Mine, and finally Year 9 have been pretending to be 7-year olds for their 'Blood Brothers' duologues. Mr Meadows has also invited Year 9 to audition for Jim Cartwright's 'Two', with rehearsals to get underway soon.

It is open to students studying Geography in year 10 and those students who opt for Geography as a GCSE option in year 9.




The itinery includes: -

Supporting Stanchester's Development

Throughout this term we are being joined by curriculum specialsits from the Bridgwater & Taunton College Trust, who will be looking in depth at how we teach each subject.

Along with the subject leader from Stanchester they'll observe lessons, review resources and speak to students to help us develop our curriculum.

They have already looked at Maths, and reported that the strengths of the curriculum include: -

- Behaviour in most lessons.
- Quality of modelling.
- Responsive teaching across teachers and classes.
- Good relationships and trust in the classes. Students are there to work and do engage in the work lessons
- Students had lots of positive things to say about
 Maths for example, levels of in lesson feedback.
- In books, home learning feedback questions are used well.
